In December, Otto Siegle, Genius Coach, worked with the gifted teachers to remind them of "The Power of Play." The teachers learned to toss and catch sticks, use flowing arms bands, and just have fun overall with toys. Play is children's first language. It helps them develop confidence, think outside the box, and feel joy. Mr. Siegle reminded us, as adults, we sometimes get caught up in our everyday responsibilities and forget to play. Try taking some time out of your schedule soon to just play with your child or children and see how it feels.



Gifted Students Benefit From Grants

A number of gifted teachers in our district were awarded grants last year to help them enrich the education of our gifted students.

*Monica Dunham(Cholla Middle School) received an APS "Supply My Class" teacher award of \$500. She purchased a Magnetic Coordinate Grid, a magnetic circle for Geometry and trigonometry manipulatives.









- * Robin Blank (Sahuaro/ Sweetwater) and Heather Davis (Maryland/ Lakeview) received grants from the Arizona Council of Economic Education for their gifted classes to participate in the "Stock Market Game." Students are given a fictional \$100,000 to invest in stocks and learn about economics, investing, and personal finance.
- *Patti Ahlman (John Jacobs) received a mini-grant from Alpha Epsilon (ADK) for the purchase of Rubik's cubes. The 4th-6th graders developed perseverance and grit while learning the algorithms needed to solve the cubes.
- * Shirit Levine received the Washington Education Foundation Grant. She used the money to buy interesting and challenging books for her classroom's SEM-R unit.
- *Sharon Michael (Mountain View) received a \$5,000 grant and 500 tickets from the AZ Diamondbacks, which she used for 3D printer materials and flexible seating for her class.


