MY CHILD IS GIFTED, NOW WHAT?

Your child recently took a cognitive abilities test which determined they scored in the gifted range (95th-99th percentile) in one or more of the three areas. There are three parts to the test Verbal (word puzzles), Quantitative (number puzzles), and Nonverbal (spatial/picture puzzles). Gifted students are unique learners and often need academic support outside the regular classroom. In some schools, students who score close to qualification (87th-94th percentile) are invited as guest learners to gifted classes and will retest the next school year.

In the Washington Elementary School District, the services provided for gifted learners are:

• Project Potential: A pull-out program at each school where students work on project-based learning twice a week with a gifted endorsed teacher

Application Based Programs:

- The Gifted Learning Center (K-6): A self-contained program for students who score high on all three areas of cognitive ability testing. Students receive gifted services all day.
- The FLEX Program (7th/8th):A self-contained program for students who score high on all three areas of cognitive ability
