The GLC is multi-age. All K-6 students have a homebase and electives together providing opportunities for older students to mentor the "littles" and create a GLC family.



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Our GLC students love to read! For English Language Arts students receive instruction based on their ability level not their grade level. GLC Students experience cross curriclular project-based learning connected to their Soc. St. and Science topics. This year they worked on an Instagram reading challenge, GifTED talks, Native American, human body, and biome projects.



In math, GLC students al work at their ability level, not grade level. The GLC has students working on junior high and even some high school skills in math. There is no celing in learning at the GLC. Students also solve crticial thinking problems in teams using "Building Thinking Classrooms."
