Gifted Testing:



Students will need a score in the 95th percentile or higher on one area or more of a cognitive abilities test to qualify for gifted services in the 2022-23 school year. Students who were close to qualification in the 2021-22 school year will be invited to retest on the CogAT. Gifted teachers will be in contact with families at the beginning of the 2022-23 school year. If you would like to refer a child for testing for the 2022-23 school year, talk to the gifted teacher on your campus or complete the screening form and permission located on the Gifted Services webpage.

All second graders in the district will be tested on the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) from May 2-10. Each school and 2nd grade teacher will make a plan for testing and send home a letter about the test. Students who have already qualified for gifted services may retest to see if they qualify in another area. Any 2nd grader who was referred for spring testing this year will wait until the May window to test with their class. Qualification letters will be sent out to all students who qualify for gifted services after this testing. If you do NOT want your child tested/ retested please let their homeroom teacher know. Students in the Gifted Learning Center (GLC) will not be tested.

Applications for the GLC/ FLEX Gifted Programs

Did you know WESD has self-contained gifted programs for highly-capable gifted learners? If your child has gifted scores of 95th percentile in one area (gifted) and has a second score above the 90th percentile and a third score above the 80th percentile, he/she is eligible for our K-6th grade Gifted Learning Center at Sahuaro Elementary or our 7th-8th grade Flex Program at Cholla Middle School. In these programs students receive instruction at their ability level instead of at grade level. Gifted students thrive in learning environments with faster-paced instruction, choice, project-based learning, and other high-ability gifted learners.

Applications are due by **April 15, 2022**. You will receive notice of acceptance by May 6, 2022. If all the spaces are not taken, we will continue to accept applications throughout the year. On the other hand, if necessary, a wait list will be created. **Applications are currently open!** Link to applications on district website and below.

- *Gifted Learning Center Application (GLC) Kinder-6th grade in the 2022-23 school year
- *Flex Gifted Program 7th-8th grade in the 2022-23 school year
- *Teacher recommendation form (one required per student application)

Please be aware that daily transportation to the GLC at Sahuaro Elementary and Cholla Middle school <u>are not provided</u>, however before-school and after-school care is available. Sahuaro school hours are 7:30 a.m. -2:30 p.m. and Cholla Middle school hours are 8:15 a.m.-3:15 p.m., except for early release Wednesday.

It's time to start thinking about summer programs! This year the WESD gifted program will host a "Mysteries of our World" summer session for grades 1st-6th. We will be exploring mysterious people, places, and events such as the Bermuda Triangle, Big Foot, urban myths, and mythical creatures. 

Using PAX students try to be on their best behavior with no "Spleems," or off task behavior, for longer periods of time each day. Each GLC student is developing into a great PAX leader. One student, Akzel Cervantes, decided to take the program a step further and created a physical game to go along with the "good behavior game." He used the computer program Bloxels to animate his game and make virtual "Spleems." The PAX creators were so impressed they decided to come to Sahuaro (from Tucson) to meet Akzel, his teachers, and his classmates to see how PAX is working for them.
