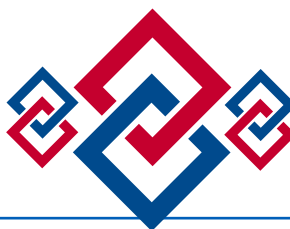

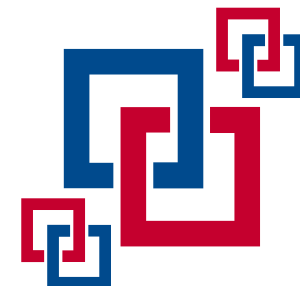


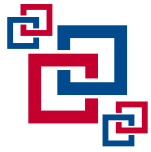

The mission of the WESD Social Services Department is to help students, in partnership with families and the community, achieve optimal educational success. School social workers provide services to reduce barriers to education, increase social/emotional growth and provide links to needed resources.

The WESD Social Services Department links together home, school and community and provides services to promote and support students' academic and social success. Using nationally recognized practice models; social workers, parent liaisons, and Washington Resource Information Center (WRIC) staff provide the following services to WESD students and families (services and staffing vary at each school site):

Individual and Group Support related to social skills, problem solving, conflict resolution, anger management, grief and loss that are interfering with the learning process.

Prevention Services include school-wide programs and class presentations/meetings to address such topics as bullying, empathy, responsible decision making, self-awareness, kindness, respect, conflict resolution, self-management, social awareness, peer relationships, and character education.



Crisis Intervention for schools, students and families due to a traumatic event or loss.

Parenting education and supports that focus on behavior, family situations, or school concerns that affect student success.

Referral Services for family situations or needs that may arise such as housing, food, clothing, job training, medical issues, counseling, etc.

Case Management Services to coordinate resources and services to promote student learning and success.

Emergency clothing, back packs, school supplies, food/snack packs, and other basic needs assistance upon availability.

Bully Response and Intervention by providing support to students involved in a bullying situation and coordinating with

the school's administrative team.

McKinney-Vento eligibility determination and services are provided to families and students that lack a fixed, adequate, or regular nighttime residence.

Refugee and Immigrant support services are provided to students and families transitioning to life and school in the United States.

Family Resource Centers, WRIC (Washington Resource Information Center), provides early intervention, readiness and education programs to strengthen families with children birth to 5 years old.
