

Updating Attendance Boundaries

Maryland Elementary • Ocotillo Elementary • Palo Verde Middle School

WESD Rationale for Current New Proposals

- Improve student safety, reduce transport times and decrease costs by minimizing busing of students across I-17
- Maximize the use of our buildings and space based on enrollment
- Standardize our District to be a natural East/West split with attendance boundaries on either side of I-17
- Work to establish a more stabilized enrollment across the District
- Reduce the amount of time students are on a bus by attending a closer school



Proposal Details

- 151 students in Kindergarten through 8th grade currently live in the three apartments West of I-17 that are within the Maryland attendance boundary
 - 。 28 are 7th and 8th graders
 - ^o 123 are Kindergarten 6th grade
- Change would add approximately one classroom of students to Palo Verde and four to Ocotillo
- Original attendance boundary configuration was designed in 2006 to accommodate for overcrowding at Ocotillo
 - This change would put the attendance boundaries back where they were originally



Rationale

- Enhance safety crossing I-17, minimize transportation time, and reduce costs
- Provide greater flexibility for future enrollment and program needs within the District
- Standardize East/West attendance boundaries within the District
 - Would now simplify the boundary to North of Bethany Home Rd and West of I-17 for the newly affected area



Grandfather Options

Maryland to Palo Verde


- For one year only (2020/2021), allow 7th graders an opportunity to stay at Maryland for 8th grade to promote with their peers
- Transportation would be provided for this one school year

Maryland to Ocotillo

- Allow K-6 grade levels to follow WESD open enrollment guidelines
- No additional transportation to be provided outside of standard operations






Maryland
