
Orangewood School 7th/8th Grade Newsletter

7th Grade English/Language Arts

Wow! What a great month of learning it has been in our class! We have dived right into Unit 1: Conflicts & Clashes by reading a variety of fiction stories. We have analyzed plot and character development throughout each text. We continued to practice using textual evidence to support our predictions and inferences. Next month we will be completing our first essay!

7th Grade Math

7th grade math has started the year by learning all about proportional relationships. Proportional relationships include finding equivalent ratios, drawing a scaled copy of a shape, and finding the constant of proportionality. I look forward to starting our Unit 1 project where students take a recipe and learn how to double it proportionally.

8th Grade English/Language Arts

Together we have completed our first read of Edgar Allan Poe' *Tell-Tale Heart*. We have been learning about the power of inference and how readers can engage with the text by adding meaning to it. We have also been working on gathering textual evidence that supports our inferences!

8th Grade Math

8th grade has been learning about transformation of shapes on the coordinate plane. This includes translations, reflections, and rotations. We found coordinates of the images and learned about their properties. This concept is important in making video games and animated movies!


