ATTENDANCE

Good attendance is an essential part of a successful middle school experience!

In an effort to minimize interruptions to the classrooms at the end of the day, students cannot be checked out any later than 3:00 p.m. on regular school days and 1:30 p.m. on early release days. This time is reserved for announcements, homework assignments and end-of-the-day instructions. Parent/guardian must also be present to show his or her ID before a student can be called out. Please keep this in mind when making appointments.

Absences

When a student is absent, a parent/guardian must call the school on or before the day of the absence to advise the school as to the reason for the absence. **Our Attendance Office number is 602-896-5422.**

Messages may be left on the Attendance Office number 24 hours a day. **Only a parent or guardian can call and excuse an absence.**

If a call is not received, the school will attempt to contact the parent/guardian at home or work. If telephone contact is not made, the student must present a note signed by his or her parent or guardian to the Attendance Office upon return to school stating the reason for absence.

Tardy

Three unexcused tardies to school or class will result in an after-school detention.

Positive Behavior, Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

Cholla Middle School is a PBIS school where respect, safety, and responsibility are necessary for a positive learning environment.

For students who meet and exceed our PBIS expectations, we have many ways to acknowledge and reward this positive behaviors! Our Charging Forward tickets are awarded to students who are “caught doing good” and each week we have a drawing of 10 tickets on morning announcement. Winners receive prizes such a VIP lunch table outside or VIP basketball court at lunch. We also host a Student Success Assembly each quarter to acknowledge our students who are going above and beyond each day to make Cholla a great place to be!

Classroom Agreements/School Expectations

Specific expectations for respect, safety, and responsibility are posted throughout our entire campus and vary among locations. These posted expectations serve as a friendly way to remind students of the behaviors we would like to see them exhibiting each day. Each classroom will develop a set of classroom agreements with students at the beginning of the year. These agreements will set the expectations for behaviors within the classroom and a focus on responsibility, safety and respect.

Classroom Behavioral Interventions and Management

Students receive redirection and support from teachers throughout the sequence of steps and are encouraged to reflect, make positive choices, and follow our expectations of respect, safety, and responsibility. Students who have difficulty meeting the expectations and agreements set forth may have the following actions applied:

- Re-direct/Re-teach
 - Each day students are afforded a re-direct/re-teach for behaviors that do not meet the classroom agreements.
- In-class Isolation
 - The student is asked to move to a specified area within the classroom to process their behavior and then join the class.
- Out-of-class Isolation
 - The student is asked to leave the classroom and go to a partner teacher for the remainder of the period. A detention is assigned and parent contact occurs. The teacher and student will conference about the behaviors.
- Office Referral
 - The teacher will complete the appropriate documentation and turn it in to Administration for follow-up. The student may be asked to go to the office or a partner classroom until the

documentation can be completed. Administration will process behaviors according to district policy and procedure. Students may earn this for repeated negative classroom behaviors or immediately for severe behaviors.

Detentions

Detentions will be given for not following the rules at Cholla Middle School.

Lunch Detention will be served when a student fails to wear his or her ID or is unable to complete a regular detention. Lunch detention is served in the cafeteria and will last for approximately 30 minutes. Students who serve a lunch detention will be served lunch that meets the District nutritional guidelines.

Regular Detention will be served from 3:15 p.m. until the late bus arrives (approx. 4:30 p.m.). Students will serve this detention for tardies to school/class or other campus infractions that do not require suspensions. Students serving this detention will be supervised in a classroom where they will remain seated, will not speak, will not bother others and will not do any school work.

Failure to complete any detention that is assigned to a student will result in a student center referral and an in-school suspension will be issued for the following day. A late bus will be provided for any student who is eligible to ride the bus.

Students will be supervised by a Cholla staff member during detentions.

Gum

Cholla is a “no gum” school. If you are chewing gum on the Cholla campus, you will receive a detention.

Public Display of Affection (PDA)

PDA is considered a disruption to the educational environment. Students violating this policy will receive consequences in line with the District policy for disorderly conduct.

Student Center Policy and Referrals

Serious infractions of any school rules may result in detention, suspension, or expulsion, depending on the severity of the offense. When appropriate, the police will be notified. Parents will be notified of any referral to the Student Center. In the event of a student suspension, due process will be provided to the student in accordance with Washington Elementary School District Governing Board policy and regulations.

In-school Suspension (ISS)

Students who have to be removed from the ISS room for disrupting the educational environment will be sent home for the remainder of their suspension.

Backpacks

Cholla is a NO BACKPACK/BAG CAMPUS. Backpacks, book bags, shoebags, sacks and purses used as book bags are **not** to be carried by students on the Cholla Middle School campus. The rationale for this action includes improvement of student organization, improvement of student achievement, and

improvement of campus safety and security. Students may use backpacks to transport belongings to and from school. The backpack must be placed in the backpack storage facility before entering campus. Backpacks will be secured for the day and available for student pickup after the dismissal bell. Purses carried by students may be no larger than 8"x9" in size. If a backpack or anything used as a backpack is brought onto campus, it will be confiscated and returned to a parent or guardian. Students who need to bring gym clothes to school are required to bring them in a plastic bag.

Electronic Devices

Cholla has an "Off and Away" policy regarding electronic devices. Cholla does not recommend bringing electronic devices to school and is not responsible for any lost or stolen electronic devices on campus (including cell phones, iPods, MP3 players, cameras, etc.). Students are not allowed to use these items on campus at any time; therefore, they will be confiscated if seen on campus. A parent or guardian may pick up any confiscated item in the front office before school or between 3:15 – 4:00 p.m.

Dress Code

The dress code is part of the high expectations and standards that Cholla has set. A standard of dress is instituted to establish an atmosphere conducive to learning and is a constant reminder to the students that their purpose in coming to school is to learn.

Students are expected to dress in a neat, attractive fashion reflecting pride in themselves and their school. The dress code is established to help ensure an atmosphere conducive to learning.

Student dress must conform to the following guidelines:

- Shirts/blouses must have sleeves that cover the entire shoulder.
- Leggings or tights must be covered by a shirt, skirt or dress that is fingertip length or longer.
- Clothing shall not expose the chest, abdomen, genital area, buttocks and shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all time; e.g., colored bras, sports bras and basketball shorts.
- Clothing such as see-through or fish-net fabrics, spaghetti straps, racerback, tops, backless tops or dresses, halter tops, low-cut tops, bare midriff tops that show the belly button when arms are raised above the head, hip-hugger pants that are too low and excessively short shorts or skirts are prohibited even when layered with appropriate clothing.
- Clothing should fit properly, not being overly loose, baggy, saggy or overly tight. Pants/shorts must fit on the waist so as to be able to remain on the waist without the aid of a belt. Jerseys must be accompanied with an undershirt
- Hats, caps, beanies, visors, hairnets or bandannas are not allowed anywhere on campus.
- Hoods are not to be worn on campus.
- Belts must fit appropriately and not hang from the waist.

- Clothing/accessories that may identify a student as "gang-related" (colors, numbers, area codes etc.) are not acceptable.
- Pajamas and slippers may not be worn to school.
- Pierced jewelry may not distract from the educational environment.
- Jewelry/accessories/clothing may not display profanity, provocative or suggestive statements, pictures, obscenities, weapons, advertising for drugs or alcohol, or gang identifications. Spikes or studs on any belt or jewelry are not allowed.
- Make-up, hairspray, perfume, combs and brushes are not to be used in classrooms or the cafeteria.

Fashions or fads that become a health or safety hazard will not be permitted.

The Cholla administration will determine appropriateness and has the final call on all dress-code violations.

Student IDs and Z-Passes

All Cholla students are required to wear IDs and Z-Passes while on the Cholla campus. Students will be provided a picture ID and Z-Pass at the beginning of the school year at no cost. Students will be checked for compliance during homeroom and throughout the school day. **Students who do not wear their IDs in a visible location will be issued a lunch detention.** Students will be issued a temporary pass to board the bus at the end of the school day. **Students who fail to attend their lunch detention will be assigned an after-school detention and may not be provided a temporary pass for their afternoon bus ride.** Z-Passes will be utilized when students are transported in one of our school buses at any time during the school year. If students deface, destroy and/or render their ID/Z-Passes unreadable or lose their ID, they will be required to purchase a replacement ID for \$5.

ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS

Makeup Work

If work is incomplete due to illness or other reason accepted by the administration, a student will have one day for each day absent in which to make up the work assigned during the absences. Parents may request makeup work from the Student Center if their child is or will be absent three or more consecutive days.

Eighth Grade Promotion Celebration

Students must achieve a 1.0 or D average in each academic class to qualify for the Promotion Ceremony. If a student earns an "F" in the last quarter, this will impact the privilege(s) of attending the promotion activities but will not impact the Promotion Ceremony if all other criteria is met. If a student is suspended at the time of the Promotion Ceremony, he or she will not earn the right to participate in the ceremony. Students who have received multiple disciplinary actions for significant behavior concerns resulting in suspension(s), will be in jeopardy of not participating in the promotion activities.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Incentive Field Trips

At times during the year, Cholla may offer quarterly incentive field trips. Unless otherwise specified, the standard criteria for attending an incentive trip are as follows:

- No Fs or Us on the most recent school report card or midterm report.
- No In-school Suspension or Out-of-school Suspensions in the period of time leading up to the field trip.
 - Quarter 1 field trip qualification period: First day of school through date of first field trip (TBD).
 - Quarter 2 field trip qualification period: Day after Q1 trip through Q2 field trip date (TBD).
 - Quarter 3 field trip qualification period: Day after Q2 trip through Q3 field trip date (TBD).
 - Quarter 4 field trip qualification period: Day after Q3 trip through Q4 field trip date (TBD). Fourth quarter midterms will be used for qualifications on this trip.

After-school Activities

The Parent/Student Handbook rules and procedures apply to all after-school activities. The following guidelines outline our procedures for determining student eligibility for any extracurricular activities:

Sports Participation:

Eligibility for competition will be determined by quarter report cards and midterm reports. An academic grade of “F” or conduct grade of “U” in any subject on a District report card or a District midterm report will make a student ineligible for competition until the next reporting period.

A student may regain eligibility status:

1. At the next reporting period (a District report card or District midterm report). This is defined as no “Fs” in any academic subject or “Us” in conduct or effort.

Or

2. After a minimum of two weeks from the onset of the ineligibility, the athlete can prove that his or her deficiency has been corrected and all other grades and conduct marks are still in good standing.

The athlete must present proof to the coach and athletic director. The "two week petition" may only be used to make an athlete eligible.

Other After-school Activities:

Students receiving a grade of an “F” or a “U” in behavior may be determined ineligible at the end of each nine-week grading period.

Ineligibility applies to all activities that occur outside the realm of a normal school day and have no grade or credit attached to student participation.

1. Ineligible students may, at the discretion of the sponsor, practice with teams or organizations that require it. These

students may not represent the school by dressing in uniform or actual participation in the event or contest.

2. Activities affected by these standards include clubs, activities, athletics, and school dances.
3. Coaches and sponsors are responsible for checking each member of their activity for eligibility to participate and subsequently informing them of their status.
4. A student must be in attendance for at least half of the school day to be eligible to participate in any school-sponsored activity or event.

Students involved in after-school activities are not allowed to participate if they are serving in-school or out-of-school suspension during the day of activity.

STUDENT RECOGNITION

Honor Roll

Students earning a grade point average of 3.0 to 3.70 on their report card are placed on the Honor Roll. Students receiving a grade of “F” or a “U” in behavior or effort will not be eligible for the Principal’s List, Honor Roll, or Academic Excellence.

Principal’s List

Students earning a grade point average of 3.71 to 3.99 on their report card are placed on the Principal’s List.

Academic Excellence

Students earning a grade point average of 4.0 on their report card are placed on the Academic Excellence List.

TRANSPORTATION

Riding on a District bus is not a right but a **privilege**. Students must maintain safe and appropriate behavior on the way to school/home, at the bus stop and on the bus.

Bus reports will be issued for violations of bus rules. Parents will be notified of all bus reports. Infractions of bus rules will result in loss of privilege to ride a WESD bus. Please refer to the District handbook for bus rules.

Students requesting to ride a bus they do not regularly ride must take a written request, signed and dated by a parent, to the office for authorization prior to 8:10 a.m. The request must also include the route number of the bus to be ridden.

Late Bus

A late bus is provided Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 4:30 p.m. and at 2:45 p.m. on early release days. Students will be dropped off at the area elementary school nearest to their home. All bus rules apply to the late bus.

Note from Administration

All rules and expectations are put into place to insure a safe and inviting environment for all students to learn. Any student who mistakenly transports a prohibited item onto campus is encouraged to bring it directly to administration upon discovery. All efforts will be made to rectify the situation fairly. We ask that you support our efforts to provide the best educational experience for all students at Cholla Middle School.
