#### **Key Findings:**

- Academic Preparation: 89% of parents felt their child was prepared for the next grade level
- Student Support: 87% of families reported their child knows they can seek aca-



demic help from adults. 80% of parents stated their child is excited about school. Perceptions of school leadership responsiveness improved to last year.

- Parent Engagement: Across categories like communication of grades, events, and accessibility of teachers, responses were slightly more favorable to the previous year.
- Safety, Behavior, and Climate: 87% of parents agreed their child feels comfortable on campus. Reports of bullying declines. School cleanliness, safety and maintenance received approval ratings.
- School Operations: Satisfaction with meal quality increase, with 73% of parents stating their child has enough to eat.
- District Climate: 75% of parents found district communication valuable. District letter grades improved.
- Parent Recommendation: Among 625 qualitative responses, most were neutral. Suggestions emphasized enhancing communication consistency and clarity between schools and families.

#### **Summary of Progress:**

Overall, the survey revealed improvement in most areas compared to the previous school year, which included academic, operational, and communication standards. But there were areas for growth including addressing bullying and fostering greater parental engagement.
