



Meeting Minutes

April 2, 2025

Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:34 pm on April 2, 2025.

1. Roll Call

The following members were present: Kimberly Gessner, Krystal Crown, Rula Prock, Traci Auten, Erika Seeley, and Cristina Martinez.

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

• Soccer season is happening. Principals from seven of our schools are organizing the schedule for their teams to follow. Mr. and Mrs. Bond are coaching the 5-6 grade co-ed team. Isaiah Seeley, as a

volunteer, is helping coach. Tax credit funds are being used to finance the paid coaches for this highly popular sport.

4. Old Business

- · 'Read to Succeed' data is being collected and updated. Some of the teachers indicate that their classes are not fully participating in the program because of the writing element. Students love to read, but don't want to write about what they read.
- · Mrs. Gessner indicates that our IAP is on target at this time.

5. New Business

- Our attendance percentage rose by 2% in March! We are really pushing for perfect attendance this month, especially during the testing weeks. Mr. Zaragoza has had perfect attendance for three days in a row. Seven students are now in the truancy system.
- · 'Reboot' assemblies were enjoyed by students with staff reminding all of the behavior expectations while on campus. Emphasis was given to behavior in the bathrooms and on the playground. Behavior issues decreased in March from those reported in February.
- Testing has begun. It is wonderful to see the support given to each other during this stressful time. Classrooms are surprising other classrooms with small treats and notes of encouragement. Staff members are providing snacks/treats for other staff members throughout the testing period.
- We discussed the many events and celebrations we have enjoyed on campus this last month including; Tiger Ticket assemblies, Field Day's, Read Across America Week where we had many guest readers visit out campus and read to students, Literacy Night, 4-6 Grade Choir Concerts and Talent Show try-outs. It has been a busy month.
- We discussed ways to make Literacy Night more effective for our students and their families including; making sure the week of the event is not busy with other events, holding it later in the day, including family games, and providing treats. No decisions were made at this time.
- The parking lots and bus bay areas will be reconfigured and reconstructed over the summer. Construction is slated to begin May 1st.
- Ms Gessner shared the staffing needs for the 2025-26 school year. There will be two sections for the following grade levels: KG, 1, 3, 4,

and 6. Grades 2 and 5 are projected to have three sections each. We will only have two SPED teachers.
