



Meeting Minutes

Sept. 3, 2025

Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:31 pm on Sept. 3, 2025.

1. Roll Call

The following members were present: Kimberly Gessner, Rula Prock, Traci Auten, Erika Seeley, Brian Camilli, and Bonnie Kunz.

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

- Tryouts for Boys Basketball have been held. Coach Camilli anticipates about 17 students will be on the team. The team roster will be posted next week.
- · Cross Country will again be coached by Laura Hamblen. Practices will begin soon as weather permits.

4. Old Business

- Tumbleweed currently has three open positions: SNPS staff, a monitoring position, and a para pro for Tigerland. Interviews are scheduled.
- The Read to Succeed Cart made the rounds. Snacks and Coupons continue to be popular rewards for the students. Ms. Stock's KG class had 22 students complete their reading goals for September.
- · Mrs. Gessner indicates that our IAP goals have been reviewed and we will continue to work on the same goals this year.

5. New Business

• MTSS goals were reviewed during pre-week. There is only one new teacher, and he will be mentored weekly as he learns the systems. The theme for MTSS this year is "Purpose & Endurance", do what you do with purpose and never give up.

- AASA Data has been reviewed. The School Grades will be published in October.
- A HUGE shout out to Krystal Crown! Her hard work and dedication to keeping staff on track has been invaluable. She has been cheerleading each staff member weekly, helping them to be organized and setting them up for success. Thank you, Krystal!
- Student numbers are down district wide by about 700 students. At Tumbleweed, we are down 53 students from the end of last school year. One fourth of our students are here on 'Open Enrollment'. Because of the number of students we have, class sizes are larger. We lost five class sections due to declining enrollment. We discussed what we can do to attract more students to our school.
- · We discussed ways to make Literacy Night more effective for our students and their families including; making sure the week of the event is not busy with other events, holding it later in the day, including family games, and providing treats. No decisions were made at this time.
- Mrs. Gessner reviewed the Tax Credit Balances available at this time. She reminded us that as Site Council we will be responsible for approving any use of Undesignated Funds.
- · Attendance for the month of August is up from last year. We currently have one of the lowest absenteeism in the district.
- Behavior trends for the month of August are up from last year. Our larger classrooms are the ones where students are having more behavior issues.

6. ASA Updates

- Tumbleweed is one of three schools that were awarded a new 5 Year 21st Century Grant for After School Academy. Danielle Ashenbrener is directing this program again this year.
- · Kiwanis Dollar Wars will begin in September. We keep 80% of all funds donated for this event.

7. PTO

• The event held at Great Skate raised over \$500 for Tumbleweed. Thanks PTO and Great Skate for a fun event.
