Suggested Student School Supplies

Supplies are provided for students with the exception of a water bottle and a backpack. If you prefer to buy your own supplies, below is a general list:

- Backpack, preferably not on wheels
- Headphones for Chromebook
- 2-pocket folder, without prongs, for homework (please no binders or spiral notebooks)
- 3 standard pencils
- Pencil sharpener that holds pencil shavings
- Water bottle, brought to school daily
- Glue stick
- Box of 16 or 24 crayons
- Scissors
- Expo marker
- Personal chapter/reading books (for silent reading)



Rationale: Student space is limited. Please do not bring extra supplies to school.

Study skills are an important part of being a successful student. There is very little room in our student desks, and unnecessary school supplies create clutter. The above list is what is needed for organizational success. Extra materials should be kept at home to enrich your child's homework area.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES NEEDED

The following supplies will be used daily in our class

- Backpacks
- Supply box (must fit in desk)
- Personal water bottles – use daily
- 3 plastic folders (take home, unfinished work, reading centers)
- Pencils and erasers– buy for the whole year–many 4th graders prefer mechanical pencils.
- 3 notebooks (Language Arts, Math, Science)
- Crayons – no larger than a 24 pack
- Scissors

- Red pen for correcting work (no black or blue pens, please)
- Expo markers

Suggested Supply List

Personal supplies – not shared

- 4 separate notebooks (yellow, blue, orange, and red)
- 1 RED folder
- A small supply box or pouch that will hold supplies

- Personal pencil sharpener
- Pencils (many kids like mechanical in 5th grade)
- Dry erase marker

Shared Supplies – donated to the class

- Tissues, disinfectant wipes, hand sanitizer (pump), extra pencils, extra dry erase markers



6th Grade School Supply List

Dear Parents/Guardians of incoming 6th Graders,

We are so excited to welcome students to the new school year! We wanted to inform you about a couple of pieces of information. 6th grade is departmentalized. Your child will rotate to different teachers throughout the day. Because of this, your child will not have their own desk to put supplies in.

In order to get students prepared for middle school, we 6th grade teachers, ask the following things:

- All backpacks are left in the classroom (students will carry around binders with them to promote organization and efficiency).
- Cell phones are to remain off and in backpacks while on campus.
- Students will check a chromebook out from Mr Maasen (during the first couple days of school). We ask that these are taken care of, brought to each class, and left at school at the end of the day. Students will be responsible for their chromebooks, so any damages (such as missing keys or cracked screens) will be under the responsibility of parents/guardians (\$\$).
- Dress code is enforced (no crop tops, hats, or sagging). All students must have their ID with a lanyard and a pouch (around their neck at all times during the school day).
- Any personal items that need to be carried around, will need to fit in the student's pencil pouch.

Apart from a binder, we ask students to be prepared with the following items:

- Water bottle (as students transition from class to class)
- 3 ring binder (2 inch is preferred)
- Pencils
- Pencil pouch
- Expo marker(s)
