Message from the Principal

Hello, Sunset Families!

Our 23-24 school year is off to a great start!

I have enjoyed my first few weeks here at Sunset getting to know our staff, students and families! This is such a wonderful place for students to learn and I am so proud to be a part of it.

We started off the school year learning and practicing common school-wide expectations in the cafeteria, playground, hallways, and dismissal. These expectations are so important because they provide consistency and predictability for students, which ultimately leads to them feeling comfortable and safe at school. To support school-wide expectations at home, talk to your students about FLASH (line expectations), and keeping the cafeteria clean for everyone.

Students have taken beginning of the year assessments for both reading and math. This provides a starting point for the skills your student knows coming into their new grade level. Our new math curriculum, iReady, provides data that shows the specific skills each student needs to practice. It then creates a personalized learning progression called "My Path" that targets those skills. Students can utilize My Path at home, and you will receive more information at our **Sunset Pride Night** on 9/7 from 4:30 – 6:30 pm.


