*****Keeping all tardies, early pick-up, and absences under 5 to 10 instances for the entire school year is academically essential to student success.*****




Arrival

Entry/Exit Points





Health Protocols


Students should stay home if they feel ill or are exhibiting symptoms of respiratory infection.

Students must use their student ID to scan on and off the bus.


Important Practices:

Dismissal Procedures

Student Dress Code Regulation (JICA-R)

Washington Elementary School District (WESD) encourages students to take pride in their attire as it relates to the school setting. Students should dress in a manner that takes into consideration the educational environment of safety, health and welfare of self and others.

District Dress Code Standards shall not interfere with individual choice regarding dress and grooming, with the following guidelines;

- **Students must wear:**

- ❖ Clothing that covers body parts (buttocks, chest, navels) with non-see-through material
- ❖ School ID's
- ❖ Shoes with hard soles

- **Students may wear:**

- ❖ Clothing that does not depict images/logos of alcohol, drugs, drug paraphernalia
- ❖ Head coverings that allow face and ears to be visible
- ❖ Religious headwear/face coverings
- ❖ Tops or dresses with straps



Important Information 2024-25 School Year:

- **WATER BOTTLE:** A refillable water bottle is essential for student hydration during the day. There are refillable stations on campus. ****Water ONLY**
- **Be on time for learning** - tardies can disrupt student learning. Start the day at 7:15 with breakfast in class.
- **Parents/Guardians are required to sign their children in at the office if they are tardy.** Parking is available off of 39th Avenue.
- **Drop off & Pick Up Safety:** Please follow all road signs, use crosswalks, and park appropriately for community safety.

Suggested Student School Supplies

Supplies are provided for students with the exception of a water bottle and a backpack. If you prefer to buy your own supplies, below is a general list:

- Backpack, preferably not on wheels
- Headphones for Chromebook
- 2-pocket folder, without prongs, for homework (please no binders or spiral notebooks)
- 3 standard pencils
- Pencil sharpener that holds pencil shavings
- Water bottle, brought to school daily
- Glue sticks
- Box of 16 or 24 crayons
- Scissors
- Expo markers
- Personal chapter/reading books (for silent reading)



Rationale: Student space is limited. Please do not bring extra supplies to school.

Study skills are an important part of being a successful student. There is very little room in our student desks, and unnecessary school supplies create clutter. SCHOOL SUPPLIES NEEDED

6th Grade School Supply List

Dear Parents/Guardians of incoming 6th Graders,

We are so excited to welcome students to the new school year! We wanted to inform you about a couple of pieces of information. 6th grade is departmentalized. Your child will rotate to different teachers throughout the day. Because of this, your child will not have their own desk to put supplies in.

In order to get students prepared for middle school, we 6th grade teachers, ask the following things:

- All backpacks are left in the classroom (students will carry around binders with them to promote organization and efficiency).
- Cell phones are to remain off and in backpacks while on campus.
- Students will check a chromebook out from Mr Maasen (during the first couple days of school). We ask that these are taken care of, brought to each class, and left at school at the end of the day. Students will be responsible for their chromebooks, so any damages (such as missing keys or cracked screens) will be under the responsibility of parents/guardians (\$\$).
- Dress code is enforced. All students must have their ID with a lanyard and a pouch (around their neck at all times during the school day).
- Any personal items that need to be carried around, will need to fit in the student's pencil pouch.


Apart from a binder, we ask students to be prepared with the following items:
