Your Guide on the Learning Journey



Below you will find the wish list of supplies for our classroom this year. Although we love the cutesy school supplies, they become a distraction, and can cause problems. Please keep specialty stationary items at home.

Shared supplies, do not label

- 2 packs of Ticonderoga pencils (Plain colors only)
- 1 pack of pencil cap erasers
- 124 pack of Crayola crayons
- 1 pack of thick Crayola markers
- 1 pack of thin Crayola markers
- 6 pack of glue sticks (No Scented)
- 1 pack of colored pencils
